



# **Starting the Process**

The University of Idaho offers bachelor's degrees in Coeur d'Alene in partnership with North Idaho College. Lower division courses are offered through NIC, and upper division courses are through UI Coeur d'Alene (in-person or distance education).

# Step 1: Apply for Admission

If you plan to enroll in both NIC and UI courses, you'll need to apply for admission at both institutions. You must be degree seeking at UI to be considered for financial aid.

#### Step 2: Submit the FAFSA

You can only receive financial aid through one institution for your degree. If you are degree seeking at UI, use the UI School Code below.

### Step 3: Register for Classes

NIC: Your <u>first</u> semester at NIC, you must meet with an NIC advisor to plan your courses.

**UI:** You must meet with your advisor <u>every semester</u> before registering for classes.

# Step 4: Complete the Consortium Agreement Form

Once you are a UI student and enroll in one or two classes at another institution such as NIC, you must complete the Consortium Agreement form each semester. See the Form and Instructions
The NIC staff in Cardinal Central can assist you in getting a signature from a Financial Aid Advisor.

#### Step 5: Pay Your Fees

Students enrolled at both NIC and UI are responsible for payment of all fees to both institutions each semester. If financial aid at either institution is insufficient and there is a remaining balance, the student is responsible for paying that balance.

IMPORTANT: When UI is the primary institution, financial aid is subject to adjustment based on total semester enrollment, institutional enrollment, institutional costs, host institution costs, and federal eligibility criteria. UI students seeking their first bachelor's degree must maintain 12+ credits each fall/spring semester for maximum eligibility of their UI financial aid.

Type of Aid	Requirements
Work Study	12 credits minimum per semester  At least 3 credits must be from UI  Must work under direct supervision of a UI Supervisor  This offer may be cancelled if semester enrollment is less than 12 total credits  If UI courses are dropped, this offer may be retracted
Loans	12 credits for maximum eligibility per semester  At least 3 credits must be from UI  Must be enrolled in at least 6 credits for minimum eligibility  This offer may be cancelled if semester enrollment is less than 6 total credits
Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG)	12 credits minimum per semester  At least 3 credits must be from UI  This award may be cancelled if semester enrollment is less than 12 total credits  If UI courses are dropped, this offer may be removed
Pell Grant	12 credits for maximum eligibility per semester  At least 3 credits must be from UI  For less than 12 total credits, proration evaluated by UI Financial Aid (UI SFAS)  Schedule an Appointment with UI SFAS for Summer Pell Grant info
Go Idaho! <u>and</u> Departmental Nomination-Based Scholarships	12 University of Idaho credits for maximum eligibility per semester  At least 3 credits must be from UI for minimum eligibility per semester  Prorations occur when less than 12 UI credits for the semester  Semester UI Credits Proration Estimates  3 - 5 UI Credits 25%  6 - 8 UI Credits 50%  9 - 11 UI Credits 75%  12+ UI Credits 100%  If UI courses are dropped for the semester, these awards may be adjusted and/or retracted

12 University of Idaho credits for minimum eligibility per semester

- At least 12 credits must be from UI to maintain WUE
- 2.5 GPA and 12+ credits per semester to renew
- This award is cancelled for the semester if less than 12 UI credits
